Meeting held in person at the Brookline Public Works building and via Zoom

The meeting opened at 7:04 p.m. There was no public input.

Approve minutes

Annual Report to the Town

Service building repair (formerly known as Vault or Tomb)

Judy presented a proposal for roof repair/update and is in the process of getting a proposal for concrete block pointing and repair work. This is planned for spring or summer this year.

Cemetery Visioning

The remainder of the meeting was spent on the 10-year visioning project, which is currently maintained as a separate document, copied below. **Judy** and **Mike** will meet in the near future to finalize the "packet" for purchasers, which is among the items envisioned.

CEMETERY TRUSTEES - 10-YEAR VISIONING THOUGHTS 1-10-23

We agreed that our activities, actions and purchases must be prioritized according to a balance among urgency, cost/benefit analysis, and availability of resources including humans. We will remind ourselves that we cannot do a ten year plan in 1 year. Or even two. ;-)

ALL

- 1. Establish **records** maintenance at BPW/Sexton office, including data and photos.
- 2. Create a "packet" of documents to provide to each purchaser.
- 3. Create an **online presence** that is readily **accessible to the public and searchable**.
- 4. Develop **volunteers** cadre.
- 5. Purchase and install **the formal signs we've researched** for Pine Grove, Lakeside and North Cemeteries. The kiosk is sufficient for Cemetery in the Woods.
- 6. Evaluate columbaria or other means of accommodating increased cremation burials.

PINE GROVE

- 1. **Roads**: Fill all significant ruts 2023; plan for 10-year maintenance (Mike)
 - a. Straighten Potanipo Way when sidewalk goes in 2023; move the granite entry posts as discussed.
 - b. Define which roads require what treatment, perhaps even how/where to encourage/discourage use.
 - c. Do we want simple post signage for Avenue/Ways?
- 2. **Corners**: Uncover buried, install missing and new. (Judy/Ann/Mike 2023 do a trial run of 100 or so corners; Mike to order, Judy to supervise summer help)
- 3. **Benches**: <u>find/buy (ACS donate) 6 small concrete ones spring 2023</u>; evaluate recently purchased small park bench; buy more if satisfactory. Goal: attractive, comfortable, durable, price-effective.
- 4. Hire ground-penetrating radar to clarify availabilities for burials and tree-planting.
- 5. **Trees**: Choose spots, tree types; lay out on map with goal dates.
 - a. Criteria: 50- to 100-year plan, durability, cemetery-friendly root systems, low maintenance
- 6. **Fencing**: coordinate Judy-Ann plan from Oct 2022 with Mike suggestions for southwest corner; execute at least some this year.
- 7. Southwest corner:
 - a. Discuss gravesite sizes, service road dimensions, traffic flow goals.
 - b. Lay out at least some of the new plot plans and ways, incorporating the above.
 - c. Consider limiting decorations on new SW corner layout (only), to accommodate those who prefer a subdued look.
 - d. Consider "lawn" will clover serve well? Ground phlox where it's happy? Low maintenance, no poison.

- 8. Repair service building.
- 9. Watering system: Complete the extension planned for 2023.
- 10. Address overall "lawn" appearance (currently applying clover in spots, which may be a good direction)
- 11. **Tidy up** the pine grove **at north end** and update kiosk map.

LAKESIDE

- 1. Life cycle trees: three large/old maples plus old along Farwell-side fence need work/removal
- 2. Address bittersweet invasion
- 3. Tidy up/identify plot corners

NORTH

- 1. Weidman/Cook gate
- 2. Annual maintenance, keep the oaklets down and trash picked up

CEMETERY IN THE WOODS

1. Annual maintenance, including washing fence and keeping young trees from growing
