

TOWN OF BROOKLINE, NEW HAMPSHIRE MELENDY POND MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

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Minutes Melendy Pond Management Committee (MPMC) Wednesday, August 11th, 2021

Attendees at the in person meeting were members Eddie Arnold, Randy Haight, Susan Holroyd and Tom Solon along with Town Administrator Tad Putney.

Eddie called the meeting to order at 6:30pm.

Minutes

Tom moved, seconded by Randy, to approve the public minutes of the May 26th meeting as written; Voted Yes 4-0. Tom moved, seconded by Susan, to approve the non-public minutes of the May 26th meeting as written; Voted Yes 4-0.

Review Draft Sublease Agreement – 2 Ninth Street

Tad reviewed the draft Sublease Agreement he had drafted for 2 Ninth Street. He said the subtenants had been available for a prior meeting, but not tonight, and the primary tenant had asked if his subtenants could simply sign an Agreement. Members suggested several edits to the document, which **Tad** will incorporate. **Tom** asked that we get the Affidavit and confirm its accuracy before the town countersigns the Agreement. **Susan** suggested we add a notary section to the Affidavit of Permanent Legal Residence. **Tad** will add it. **Randy moved, seconded by Susan, that future Affidavits include a notary signature. Randy moved, seconded by Susan, to approve the Sublease Agreement, as amended, for Lots 32 & 33, 2 Ninth Street; Voted Yes 4-0.**

Ditching Invoices

Tom asked if this represents an ongoing annual cost. **Eddie** said he thought it would be less. **Tad** noted that we also expended about \$2,000 in March on crushed stone to address mud on the road, which will be an annual expense. **Tom** said that his modeling of Melendy Pond expenses and revenues a couple of years ago assumed \$3,500 in annual road maintenance. **Tom moved, seconded by Susan, to approve payment of two invoices for ditching on Melendy Pond Road (\$1,890 and \$1,100); Voted Yes, 4-0.**

Boats

Susan said there was recent debate on Facebook regarding boats on Melendy Pond. **Randy** said that given it is more than 10 acres, it is considered a "great pond" and is under the jurisdiction of the state. He suggested reaching out to Fish & Game and see what limitations, if any, exist. **Tad** will contact Fish & Game to see what limitations exist.

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Other Business

Tad said he will contact the SAU office the second week in September regarding annual residency checks of Melendy Pond addresses. **Tom** suggested we seek, as part our request, the list of students at a Hood Road address, so we can cross-check the names with Melendy Pond tenant names. Members agreed.

It was agreed that the next meeting will be at 6:30pm on Wednesday, October 13th in the Town Hall meeting room.
