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Minutes Selectboard Monday, May 12, 2014

Selectboard members Darrell Philpot, Susan Adams, Karl Dowling, John Carr and Brendan Denehy were present along with Town Administrator Tad Putney.

Also present were Joe King, Ann Somers, Loring Webster, Helen Ballou, Eileen Labak, Ed Cook, Larry Turner, Katie Hallett and Rachel Ouellette.

Darrell opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### Minutes

Sue moved, seconded by John to approve the minutes of April 28th. Voted yes 3-0; Darrell and Karl abstained.

#### Warrants

The Selectboard approved warrant # 19 in the amount of \$829,779.85 and payroll warrant in the amount of \$46,948.85 and special detail payroll in the amount of \$640.

#### Planning Board

The Selectboard signed an appointment slip for Eric Bernstein as an Alternate Member of the planning board with an expiration date of March 31, 2017.

#### Library Trustee

The library trustees recommend that Eileen Labak be appointed to replace a trustee that is moving out of town. The Selectboard will address the appointment at the next meeting.

#### Expenses thru April

The Selectboard reviewed expenses through April. A memo was received from Valerie that the planning board Outside Consulting Service line item is over budget due to a \$2,250 invoice not getting paid out of the 2013 budget. **Darrell** asked Tad to check with Valerie on how much of the amount can be managed within the planning board budget.

#### Organ Donation

Tad said a resident of town has found an Allen Model 120c, approximately 1980 vintage organ with a value of \$1,000 for the town for use in the Chapel. It would replace the 1970 vintage presently in the Chapel. The organ would be tuned and delivered to the Chapel at no expense to the town. *Karl moved, seconded by Sue to gratefully accept the organ for the Chapel. Voted yes 5-0.* 

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#### Railtrail Grant

Tad reported that the conservation commission has received a grant to rehabilitate approximately 3,000 feet of the old railtrail between So. Main Street and Bohanon Bridge Road.

#### Proclamation

**Darrell** read a Proclamation honoring the service and contributions of Betty Hall. The Proclamation will be given to Betty on June 1, 2014 at the Brookline Community Church during the 10 am service. A gathering will be held at the Brookline Event Center after church.

#### Firefighter Memorial

Charlie Corey presented a conceptual plan of a firefighter memorial they want to have on the southern side of the fire station. It will include granite stones and 2 benches. The Selectboard approved the plan. All funds for the memorial will be from donations. **Brendan** asked Charlie to check the requirements for permits given the distance from the river.

Tad noted that the rain stopped in time for the dedication of the Curt Jensen Memorial Field on Saturday and thanked the fire department for their participation in the parade and ceremony.

#### **Blasting Ordinance**

Tad gave a summary on discussions he had with Skillings, Mailletts Water Works, Hager Richter and the NHDES relative to well water in Brookline. The consensus is that there is little risk of impacting a well from residential blasting and a small risk from drilling a new well. Darrell questioned what the problem is we're trying to solve. Sue said she would want to get her water tested if a house were being built next to her. Ed Cook of Mountain Road asked if the risk would change if we increased lot sizes. The summary didn't say. Joe King of Westview Drive said the distance in section IX, B and J should be the same distance. He read a statement and said we need to be proactive. Larry Turner of Mountain Road said he could test his water but if there are no rules, there's no place to go with the information. Having some rules would have some level of protection. Sue questioned how we would police this. Katie Hallett of Westview Road said all problems with wells aren't necessarily reported. She said it's happening often. Darrell said the well experts see no correlation between blasting and adverse effects on wells. Rachel Ouellette of Westview Road said she's more interested in a groundwater monitoring ordinance than a blasting ordinance. Joe said he disagrees that there's no correlation and said he wants to protect his water. Darrell said we need to separate the blasting ordinance from a water monitoring ordinance. The Selectboard agreed. Karl said the higher priority is the water. Brendan asked for clarification if blasting was done on a lot abutting the town line and whether the radius would count for the abutting town. The answer was we don't know. Katie suggested that if there is an adverse impact on a well, that it be reported to the town. Tad said a public hearing is scheduled for May 27th. It was agreed that the hearing will focus solely on the draft blasting ordinance and a separate ordinance on well monitoring will be pursued thereafter.

#### Fireworks Bids

Tad reported he received three bids for fireworks:

Atlas with a cost of \$5,500 for 820 shells; available dates of July  $5^{th}$  with a rain date on July  $6^{th}$ . They have provided the fireworks for many years.

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**RS Fireworks** of Hudson NH with a cost of \$5,500 for 1,088 shells; available dates of July  $5^{th}$  with a rain date on July  $6^{th}$ .

Northstar Fireworks of Vermont with a cost of \$5,500 for 822 shells; available date of July 6<sup>th</sup>.

Darrell moved, seconded by John to award the fireworks contract to RS Fireworks at a cost of \$5,500. Voted yes 5-1; Karl against.

#### PSNH – pole attachments

Karl moved, seconded by Sue to authorize Darrell to sign the annual temporary pole attachment application with PSNH. Voted yes 5-0.

#### Code of Ethics

**Tad** reported the only committees that haven't yet adopted the Code of Ethics are the Facilities Committee and Economic Development Committee. Both have scheduled meetings this month.

#### **Charter Communications**

We have been notified from Charter Communications that they are transferring their customers in Brookline to Comcast.

#### **Town Hall Roof**

**Tad** received a quote from Therrien Roofing in the amount of \$2,978 to check and replace slates on the town hall roof. Tad will submit a claim with the insurance company.

#### **Economic Development Committee**

**Darrell** asked that we invite the economic development committee to a future selectboard meeting.

#### Non Public Session

Darrell moved, seconded by Karl to go into non public session under RSA 91-A, 3 (a) personnel and (c) reputation. Voted yes 5-0.

Meeting adjourned at 9:00 pm.
